

Dear Friends,



Dear Friends in Christ,

Filled with awe and wonder at the mystery of the Incarnation, how do we welcome God Incarnate? Filled with awe and wonder at the mystery of the Eucharist, how do we approach its celebration? During this Year of Sunday Mass, it is fitting to point out that the world is different because Mass is celebrated and we participate in that celebration. Not just we individually, not just the Church, but the world as a whole would be a very different place were the Holy Eucharist not celebrated.

Since the first Christians in Jerusalem discovered their identity around the altar of the Lord on his day, Catholics have known that without the Mass they cannot live fully in Christ. By inviting us to a new life and shaping our attitudes toward this life, the Eucharist does not merely express who we are and what we believe; it helps us discover who we are and what we can become in Christ Jesus, our Lord. Full and active participation in the liturgy leads us to embrace the truth, to take up the cross, and to follow in the footsteps of Jesus throughout every dimension of our lives in praying for life eternal.

Through the Eucharist, the power of the Holy Spirit transforms us into the living Body of Christ, set to transform the world. Moreover, it moves us to express in action what it is that unites us to God and therefore to one another. When we are faithful to the image of God stamped upon us through baptism so that we are like Jesus Christ and when, in the celebration of the liturgy, our actions are witnesses to God's own transcendence, our lives our holy. When we live in the world with Christ's love, spreading his peace and justice, we are God's instruments. This in its entirety is the spirit of the liturgy. Liturgy is not about us except to the extent that we are in Christ.

As Mary eloquently expresses in the *Magnificat*: "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God my savior," may you go forth from Mass "glorifying the Lord by your life." You will be remembered in my Christmas Masses and prayers. A blessed and Merry Christmas to all!

Great News for Everyone!!

St. Bede Parish has been selected by our Vicar, Bishop George Rassas, to participate in the dollar for dollar match offered by the Annual Catholic Appeal for 2013. What this means is that for every dollar donated to the 2013 Annual Catholic Appeal by the people of St. Bede Parish, the Archdiocese of Chicago has generously agreed to match that donation 100% in debt relief. For example, a \$500 donation to the Annual Catholic Appeal will become a \$1,000 reduction in debt as a result of the match from the Archdiocese.

This is huge for us, as our debt from our construction and operational loans is close to \$1,100,000. You might recall that three years ago, St. Bede Parish was given this same opportunity through the Annual Catholic Appeal, and through your generosity, we were able to lower our debt at the time by close to \$470,000.

When we conducted our increased offering initiative in September as a result of one of the pieces to our Parish Transformation Plan, I shared with you that I would be asking for your generosity three times during the course of the year: that initial request, the Annual School Fund and the Annual Catholic Appeal. When I discovered we would be invited to do the dollar for dollar match, the Parish Finance Council recommended we suspend the Annual School Fund for one year, so that we can concentrate more fully on the Annual Catholic Appeal. The Annual School Fund will return next year.

I have asked a lot from you financially over the years and you have responded, which has allowed us to renovate and modernize our Church and build the state-of-the-art Faith Formation Center, among other things. I am asking you one more time to be as generous as you can because of the huge possibility this dollar for dollar invitation represents—it could substantially lower our indebtedness and help us return to fiscal solvency for the future.

In addition, the Annual Catholic Appeal accepts pledges to be paid throughout the year, so if you are able to offer a little more over the pledge period, that will be great. I will be donating \$1000 of my own money for this endeavor... I invite you to give what you can. As always, I truly appreciate your generosity and thank you for all you have given St. Bede Parish in time, talent and treasure.

I mention this invitation now as opposed to later in case you would like to give before the end of the year, for tax purposes. If you do wish to contribute to the 2013 Annual Catholic Appeal in 2012, please note that you need to indicate that on your check. I will have more to say about the Annual Catholic Appeal as we draw closer to the end of January.

CHICAGO'S "PARISH OF THE AIRWAVES" SUNDAY MASS AT MERCY HOME MOVING TO WGN

CHICAGO —The Sunday Mass at Mercy Home is moving to WGN television, Channel 9 this January. The popular televised Catholic Mass can be seen on WGN every Sunday from 9:30 to 10:00 a.m. beginning on January 6. Viewers should consult local TV listings for cable channel.

Sunday Mass at Mercy Home is the most popular televised Catholic Mass in the Chicago area, with 60,000 faithful viewers tuning in every Sunday morning to share in the Eucharist. The Mass will have its last airing on its current broadcast station, WCIU Channel 26, on December 30.

Sunday Mass at Mercy Home, which is filmed in front of a live congregation at Mercy Home for Boys & Girls in its on-site chapel, is a source of spiritual nourishment for those who are unable to leave their homes to attend Mass because of age or ailment. It is supported by faithful donors who help Mercy Home bring the liturgy to homebound, ailing, and elderly Catholics.

"I am so grateful to those who continue to help us bring comfort and peace each Sunday to so many of their brothers and sisters in Christ," said Rev. L. Scott Donahue, who is Mercy Home's president and the principle celebrant of the televised Mass. The Christmas Mass with Cardinal George will air on WCIU Channel 26 on Christmas Day from 8-9.
