

News From the Pastor...

Dear Friends,

This past weekend was a very busy one at St. Bede.

On Saturday, we enjoyed our annual Birthday Brunch for Jesus. It begins each year with the children of our parish participating in the "Come to the Stable" Christmas Pageant, which was created many years ago by our parishioner (and at the time school Mom) Monica Collins. I love this pageant because it tells the Christmas story in a reverent and delightful way and helps the children to learn what Christmas is all about before they get too bombarded with all the commercial stuff! Following the pageant, the children and their families were invited to Coleman Hall for a wonderful meal of sandwiches and homemade macaroni and cheese, among other treats!



On Sunday, the Knights of Columbus hosted their usual delicious Sunday Brunch, but with a few added bonuses: Santa and Mrs. Claus came to spend the morning with the children (and adults!) who shared with them what they wanted for Christmas. The Women's Club made available their famous "Cookies by the Pound," and the Confirmation students were present to lend "Helping Hands" as one of their service projects as they prepare to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation this spring.

This is one of the craziest weekends in the year, but also one of the most satisfying. Though I have little to do with any of these happenings in terms of planning or executing them, I am extremely proud of all the people who work so hard to make events like these so great... and there is a lot of effort that goes into them.

I'll tell you what though... seeing the happiness and smiles that this brings to the children of our parish who participate in these activities makes it all seem very worthwhile to me and I'm betting this ranks as the number one reason why so many adults and older kids work so hard to provide these events for the children. The children in the pageant were very cute as they re-enacted the Christmas story and it was a lot of fun to watch them swinging their mini-maracas while singing the closing song "Feliz Navidad!" These kind of events remind us that even though we all celebrate Christmas in our own way, it holds a special magical quality for young children. 




