# RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PARENT SERVICE HOUR POLICY

In determining the goals of service hours we look at the needs of the RE Program, how to keep tuition and costs to an acceptable level and to show volunteerism by having parents, high school & college students and others participate in the program.

The RE Program offers many ways to achieve the service hour goals;

- I. Required Number of Service Hours Each Program Year:
  - Each year every family is to *complete 5 service hours*.

#### II. Service Hour Yearly Deposit Check:

- Each year along with your tuition check you are to submit a service hour check in the amount of \$125 that will be held and not cashed.
- If you do not complete your 5 hours before the end of the Program year and turned in your service hour card by that date your service hour check will be cashed.
- Once you turn in your service hour card your held check will be returned to you.

### III. Working in the RE Program offers many opportunities:

- Catechist
- Assistant Catechist
- Prayer Parents
- Art Parents
- Office Assistants
- Service Project Coordinators
- Fundraising Committee
- 50% Tuition for any students in the program.
- These positions also satisfy the yearly service hour requirement.
- You must attend at least 95% of the sessions and if you are a Catechist or Assistant Catechist you need to find your own substitute.
- The Fundraising, First Communion and Confirmation Committees will be formed as soon as practical and once formed will begin to plan and execute the yearly plans.
- You must comply with all Archdiocese requirements (if you are 18 years or older) regarding Virtus Training, Code of Conduct, and Background Check, as well as completion of the Volunteer Application on the Archdiocese of Chicago website.
- If you do not comply with these requirements the tuition will be billed at full price.

## IV. Volunteering for RE or any St. Bede Events & Fundraising:

- Working as a substitute in the weekly RE program you receive number of hours worked.
- Working as a volunteer for any RE or St. Bede Fundraiser or Activity you receive number of hours worked.

## IV. Volunteering to buy or make food for Events:

#### VII. Service Hour Card
